Treasurers Report

As requested at an earlier meeting, Brian had done some research on certificates of deposit and Tiny stated that the Board would meet after the meeting to decide how best to invest our funds. After much discussion, Tiny directed Brian to invest what amounts to approximately 69% of our treasury into two separate CD's; one for a period of six months and the other for one year. Dennis requested the total expenditures for the Chapter Christmas Party and, prior to the close of business, Brian reported that the final tally was \$403.61.

A motion to accept the treasurer's report was made by Chuck and seconded by Ted. Motion carried.

New Business

Tiny raised the issue of the current limit of \$100 for Presidential discretionary spending. With costs rising, he stated that he would like to see that amount raised. After a short period of discussion, Dennis made a motion to raise that figure to \$200. The motion was seconded and there were none opposed.

> The Fenelon Place Elevator, which has been called "the world's steepest, shortest scenic railway," climbs the Mississippi River bluff at the end of Fourth Street near downtown Dubuque. It has a length of 296 feet and a vertical elevation of 189 feet. It is a funicular: a cable-driven railway powered by an engine in the upper station. The two cars always leave the upper and lower stations simultaneously, and pass at the midpoint of the track. They counterbalance each other so that the engine needs to supply only enough power to overcome friction and the different weights of the passengers in the cars.

Place Elevator (see inset) and a steam boat ride upriver, including a ride through lock & dam # 11.
