Another summer GLRC has come and gone and this one was a winner. The convention was held from August 17-19, 2012 at the Blue Mountain Resort in Collingwood, Ontario, Canada, hosted by ON VIII. Joe Kubicek, "Tiny" and Patti Kindt, and Laura and I would be representing WI VI. We were joined on our travels by Brian Gadd, the MWRC International Rep, and Bob "Skippy" Jarosz of WI XI. We decided to get a jump on our weekend by heading across Lake Michigan via the Lake Express ferry on Wednesday afternoon, thus avoiding a ride through The Mistake by the Lake (AKA: Chicago). The trip started a little rough; Bob twisted his ankle when he tripped over a mooring point on the ferry. And before you ask, that isn't why he earned the "Skippy" moniker. "Tiny" provided the membership with an update on the 2013 Spring GLRC. Bill "Bam Bam" Brown of IN I (Muncie) gave an update on the 2013 Summer GLRC. It'll be August 23-25 at the Muncie Fairgrounds. Registration is \$65.00, which includes your hospitality room, Friday burgers and hot dogs, Saturday breakfast, and a hog roast Saturday night. They're trying to go back to the old days and make this one primarily camping, but there are hotels within a few miles of the campgrounds for those who don't want to tent it. I did snag a few registration forms, and will get them out next year. PA XVIII (Erie) is hosting the 2014 Spring GLRC, and IN XIII is hosting the 2014 Summer GLRC; neither chapter had a lot of info at this time to provide. Updates should be coming out at the conference in Milwaukee.

With all the reports finally given, it was time to move on to the election of GLRC officers. For the 2012-2014 terms three of the five offices were contested. Outgoing Chairman Bill Haylett turned the gavel over to me, and it was time for quick campaign speeches and voting. In the end, Bill Haylett of NY V (Buffalo) was elected as the new GLRC International rep, Tom Peed of OH III (Dayton) was elected as the new GLRC vice chairman, and Pam Carleton of ON IV (Oshawa) was elected as the new GLRC secretary. A single vote was cast electing me to the office of GLRC chairman, and Joe Kubicek to the office of GLRC treasurer; both Joe and I were running for office unopposed. Thankfully my first official act as the new conference chairman was to close the meeting!

Our group headed into the town of Collingwood for a much needed lunch break. No dead batteries this time, but true to form we did get rained on thanks to Joe's cursed bike. Once the rain passed we rode to the top of the ski hill for a beautiful view of Lake Huron's Georgian Bay. Back at the resort we were treated to a performance of the Ontario Provincial Police's Golden Helmet precision motorcycle team. These officers gave an impressive display of riding skill. Soon it was time for the banquet. Our hosts provided us with a Greek meal, which was very different (and in my opinion very tasty). As the banquet was winding up Vice Chairman Peed called me to the podium. Once I was sufficiently trapped, he led the assembly in a rousing rendition of happy birthday, with yours truly as the guest of honor. A special thanks to my "friends" who leaked out that info.
