Old Business

In addition, Tiny said he favored the idea of forming a committee to make the decisions regarding which charities we donate to and how much should be donated.

Pete made a motion that we table this issue until the September meeting and that Tiny, in the meantime; appoint a committee to come up with potential charities and parameters for the fund. Motion seconded by Kevin and all were in favor.

- Joe, reporting in Ted's absence regarding our supply of chapter colors, advised that Silk Screening by Will is able to manufacture our colors for a few pennies less than what was quoted by the company that bought out our last supplier, Cory Graphics. And that would be for a quantity of 20 sets as opposed to the 50 sets we'd have to buy from the former Cory Graphics. Ted wanted to know how the membership wanted him to proceed.

It was decided that Ted should inquire about the cost at Will's for 50 sets and it was also stressed that he should confirm the quality would be the same as what we have gotten in the past. Ted is to use his best judgment and proceed as he sees fit.

Joe will pass this on to Ted and hopefully we'll have a final decision at our next meeting.
