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## From Your Chapter Secretary



I saddled up my Dyna Glide for this one, and had a blast. At the end stop I drew what started to be a promising hand which quickly became a foot, but "Tiny" pulled a flush and ended up with the third place hand and \$100 in prize money.

Joe won a basketball back board, making me wonder if he's been on the North side of town too long. Okay, he also scored a pretty kick ass HD beer glass; I on the other hand won a pink t-shirt (which I promptly brought home for Laura). WI XII is already making plans for next year's run, and I highly recommend supporting their efforts. WI XII is the newest Wisconsin BK chapter, and they are quickly gaining a reputation as an outstanding chapter.

And now, the road tale you've been waiting for: the 2012 International Convention in Tyler, Texas. WI VI was represented by 20 members traveling in six different groups. I believe everyone would agree that no matter what route traveled it was stupid hot! With temps topping 100 and high humidity riding was not pleasurable. For once I don't have any crazy road tales to share; Joe and I rode to and fro without a single incident. That's not to say the week wasn't tale worthy. You had Herman Kremkau's run in with a wasp inside his helmet and "Tiny" frying his leg (not once, but three times) on Chuck Homa's pipes while loading the bike on the trailer. The ever caring Chuck was deeply concerned about the patch of flesh left on his pipes. The actual convention week was fantastic with TX XXXIV doing an outstanding job as host. Hot weather made riding a chore, but we did manage to get some miles in nevertheless. The local businesses sponsored a "Rose Run", a poker style ride with \$1,000 as the top prize. Hell, you got a t-shirt just for signing up (and it was all free). If there was any complaint it was about the adult beverage situation. Tyler is located in a dry county, so local laws had the hospitality suite and hotel bar closing promptly at midnight. Being enterprising Knights many of us found ways around that issue. As usual, the chapter found many ways to make this convention memorable: Ted Engelbart's party spent a day at the home of a bona fide Texas millionaire; several of us spent Wednesday at the lake home of one of the locals (actually members of MN I now living in Texas) swimming and boating; and "Tiny" provided a little late night excitement when he became involved with "escorting" a drunken local gal out of the hotel (and someone's pants). Besides being a venue to renew friendships (and make new ones) the convention is a location for conducting yearly business for the club. Unfortunately Joe, "Tiny" and I were stuck in meetings most of Monday (and for me a few hours Tuesday morning). Here are the highlights from two very long meetings. From the Board of Governors meeting: the 2013 International Convention is being held in Hot Springs, Arkansas, from July 14-20, 2013. The host hotel is the Arlington Resort & Spa (#1-800-643-1502); if you are thinking of attending and want to stay at the host hotel I suggest contacting them ASAP, as rooms were going fast. Room rates are \$92.00 for single and \$102.00 for double occupancy. The cost for registration is \$95.00 for the full week. The 2014 International Convention will be in Waidring, Austria from June 22-29, 2014. Yes, you read that correctly; we're going to Europe, so start saving your pennies. This convention is going to be expensive, but it promises to be the trip of a lifetime and one you won't want to miss. Registration is 159.00 Euro per person, and there is no actual host hotel. There are many different places to stay, ranging from camping up to four star hotels, each with different prices. And before you ask, yes, I have info available for both of these conventions. On the political front the BOG held their elections for officers, and there was a changing of the guard. The new chairman is Lon Strayer of PA XII, the new vice chairman is Cal Ennals from NJ V, the new secretary is Bob Seelye from WA I, and treasurer remains Mike Rickard from NY V. Tri State International Rep and President of Blue Knights COPSRUN Russ Harper reported that thanks to donations made throughout the year he was able to present COPSRUN with a check for \$35,000.

Before you knew it the week was over, and it was time to saddle up and head back home. Fortunately, the next convention is right around the corner: the 2012 Summer GLRC in Collingwood, Ontario. I'll be giving you my road report in the next issue.

I encourage everyone to come up and support this ride. It is \$40 for a rider and \$40 for a passenger. With this you get the ride, a meal, a little bag of goodies (which includes a bandana), and entry into the auction. All funds go directly to fighting for a cure for breast cancer in Wisconsin. My wife and I volunteer every year to work this event, as do a lot of other members of the RRC chapter. No one gets paid for working this event. Every year we look for donation for the auction which I participate in at the event. I know I have seen a few of you there. If anyone in the club has old M/C derby covers they don't want, or know someone that has old derby covers they don't want, and wants to donate them to the Oconomowoc breast cancer ride, please let me know. One of the chapter members with the RRC Chapter has a friend that paints different scenes on them and then donates them to the Breast Cancer auction for sale. Last year we had three at the auction that got some high bids. One was a 911 scene, one was a picture depicting a military scene of three pair of boots with rifles and helmets sticking out of them (this is to honor fallen soldiers), the other one, which I purchased, was of the silhouette of a soldier standing guard with the words "Duty Honor Country." They are all nicely done. If you have anything else that is new that you would like to donate to the auction, especially if it is Harley related, we would be interested in having it. I can always come and get items or meet somewhere and pick them up. I also have raffle tickets that I can sell to you for this event. Usually we give away a bike and last year it was a new Heritage Classic and second place for the first time was \$1000.
