### LEGAL UPDATES

These particular updates come to us courtesy of Paul French, the safety officer for the MWRC. They are specific to our conference.

**Springfield, III.: House Bill 930, sponsored by Rep.** <u>Dan Beiser</u> (D-Alton), prohibits any law enforcement agency of the state or a political subdivision of the state from accepting federal funding for the establishment of motorcycle-only roadside checkpoints. The bill passed the House and Senate by unanimous votes. If approved by Governor <u>Pat Quinn</u>, the ban on accepting federal funding for motorcycle-only checkpoints would take effect immediately.

Also Senate Bill 2528, sponsored by Sen. <u>Gary Forby</u> (D-Benton), would require motorcyclists and bicyclists to wait at least 120 seconds before proceeding with caution into or through an intersection controlled by a traffic-actuated signal that fails to recognize their vehicles. Previously, motorcycle and bicycle operators were required to wait "a reasonable period of time". Passed by a nearly unanimous vote in both the House and Senate, the bill was sent to Governor <u>Pat Quinn</u> on May 24 for his consideration.
