

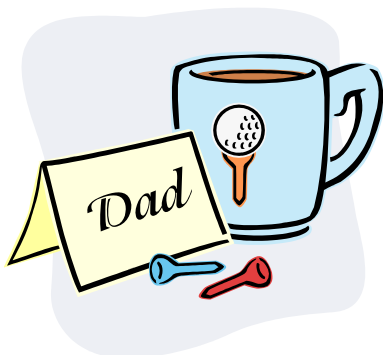


Blue Knights WI VI

HD 110 Update: From Dennis

I spoke with George Petropolous from Harley-Davidson about the upcoming HD 110th. George has taken over the police competition, and is playing a bit of catch up. Here's an update on what George is going to provide.

Passes: He's going to get some type of volunteer pass for each of you and it looks like that includes your significant other (if you've signed them up). Counting each card carrying member and their significant other we have 29 committed to helping out. I'm sending him the list of names so he can get busy on those passes. George is also working on getting a volunteer shirt for each of us, but he says HD is really keeping a tight rein on the purse strings, so this may or may not happen.

Parking: He's arranging motorcycle parking near the north end of Summerfest for us. IF you have to take a car down there parking will be on you, as they don't have facilities to park cars.

Refreshments: In addition to fluids he's working on some type of meal tickets for us.

Event schedule: George is asking that we help with the entire three day run of the competition. If you recall him speaking at the meeting, he talked about HOG having a competition on Thursday, August 29. He's asking for us to assist with running that event. The tentative schedule for the weekend is this:

Thursday, August 29. Report to Summerfest NLT 10:00 AM for a walk through of the course with competition to begin at noon. No end time provided.

Friday, August 30. Report to Summerfest NLT 10:00 AM for a walk through. Competition to begin at 11:00 AM to 6:00 PM (tentative end time).

Saturday, August 31. Report to Summerfest NLT 10:00 AM (earlier due to parade). Competition to begin at 11:00 AM to 6:00 PM (tentative end time).

Some of you have indicated that you cannot help out on Saturday due to other commitments, and George is aware of that. I've indicated on my list who can help and what days they're able to be there. IF you can't help out on Thursday for the HOG event, I need to know that ASAP.

Now, if you intend to participate in the parade you won't be able to get to Summerfest in time on Saturday. No problem, but I do need to know that you're not going to be at the competition (or will be late coming) so I can keep George advised. George is NOT able to get passes for us for the parade. The parade will cause a major disruption in traffic, so plan accordingly when you come down to Summerfest on Saturday. As I get info on the route and its impact on us I'll let you all know.

If you have any questions please let me know. Same applies if you are unable to help out. With the number of members assisting we should be able to take frequent breaks, so rest assured you won't be standing out there all day. George is also recruiting HD employees to help, so it won't fall on us entirely. If you did this at the 105th, you know that it was a long but fun day. I don't see this being any different.
